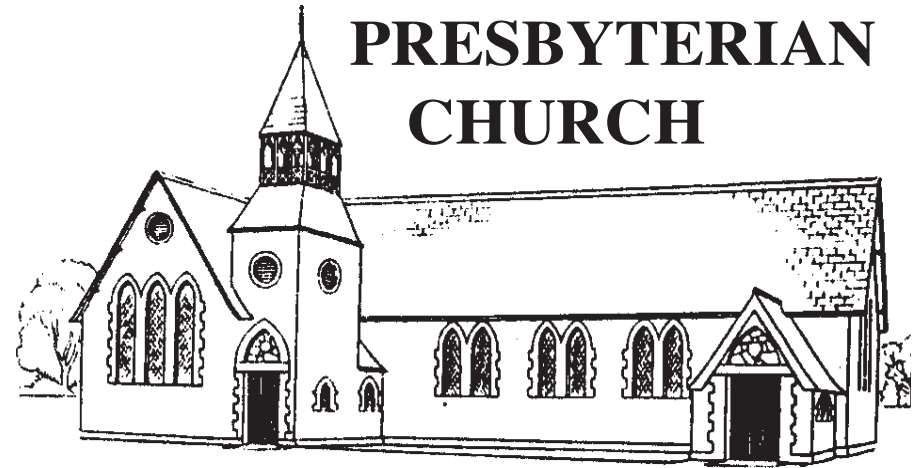
LARNE FOODBANK: The Foodbank collection continues with the basket at the back of the church. Urgently required items this month are tinned fruit, jam and noodles.
