

## Be Still

*“Be still, and know that I am God” (Psalm 46:10)*

Here God is reminding you,

**“Stop! You don’t need to do this! I am God”**

The Hebrew definition of “Be still” (raphah) means:  
**“cease striving” and “to let go and surrender”.**
