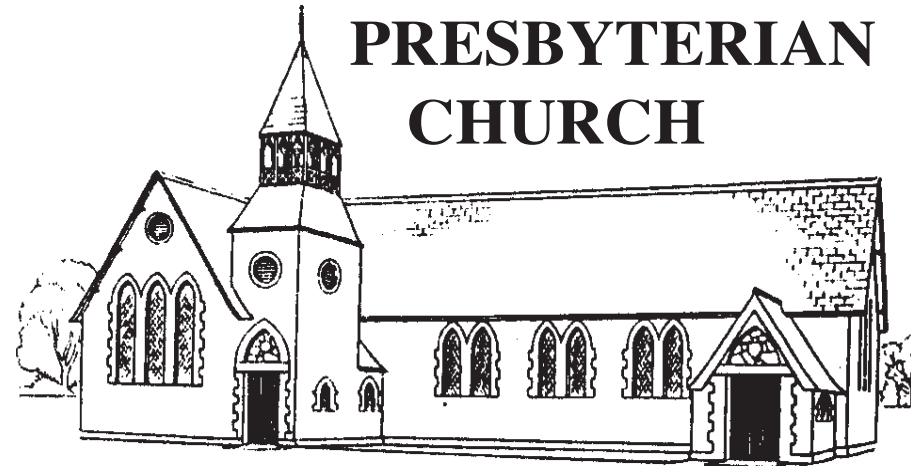

1st Give thanks for a faithful and loving God as He leads and guides us daily.

Points for Prayer

16th Pray for those in Leadership in our organisations. This is not an easy task and comes with a degree of pressure as leaders draw criticism. The answer? A consciousness of God's presence in your life.

17th Pray for all those involved with Mum's and Tots. May new friendships be formed.

18th As we prepare the church for the harvest thanksgiving, encourage all our members to support and use their skills in the various tasks.

19th Ask God to bless our special services tomorrow. Pray for the Minister, Phyllis and the choir.

20th Come, ye thankful people, come, Raise the song of harvest-home.

21st Pray for the church committee as they deliver harvest gifts to our older church members.

22nd "If you want to be depressed, look within. If you want to be defeated, look back. If you want to be distracted, look around. But if you want to be delivered, look up. By God's grace you will get through this.

23rd Remember Ricky as he continues his role as our teaching elder.

24th Pray for the staff and work of the Christian Institute as they seek to address issues and be a Christian influence in a secular world.

25th We can easily be stripped of our wealth, friends and fame, but not of our character and faith in God – those things survive the stripping's of life. (Philippians 3:8-9)
